**Easter:** Easter Sunday is the most important celebration in the Christian calendar. It marks Jesus' victory over sin and death through His Resurrection. This event is the cornerstone of the faith, offering believers hope for eternal life. The Easter readings reflect God's goodness and saving work throughout history, showing His power to bring freedom and new life to His people.

Key themes of Easter include renewal and redemption. Jesus' sacrifice and Resurrection bring forgiveness of sins and invite us to live in a renewed relationship with God. St. Paul emphasises dying to sin and being raised to new life through baptism. This reminds us to focus on heavenly things and trust in God's promises.

Easter is also a time of joy and unity. The Resurrection calls Christians to come together in celebration, sharing the Good News with others. It invites us to reflect on how faith in Jesus transforms our lives and strengthens our connection with God and one another.

As we rejoice in the Resurrection, Easter Sunday encourages us to embrace new beginnings. It reminds us to turn away from sin and live with hope, joy, and trust in God's saving grace. **Assisted suicide Bill.** The next debate in the House of Commons for the Report Stage of the Terminally III Adults (End of Life) Bill is on Friday, 16th May. If this Bill passes, assisted suicide will become legal in the UK, having devastating consequences for disabled people. The Catholic Bishops are asking for your help to stop this.
