Dear Parishioners

Last weekend we heard our guest speaker and future Missioner, Fr Royston Price, a Redemptorist, talk to us all about the Mission he will be leading this July in both parishes. By general consent, his words were well received and his talk was uplifting, challenging and entertaining..a rare combination! In fact I felt rather inadequate listening to his captivating appeal to us all not to be soggy or semi-skimmed Catholics, but I reminded myself that Father Royston was a preaching "specialist" and that the Mission would be a rich time to listen and learn for us all.

This week we have another " guest preacher" in the form of a pastoral letter from His Grace Archbishop Bernard. He deals with the very serious and urgent issue of assisted dying/ suicide. This Bill, sponsored by Kim Leadbeater MP is about to receive its Third Reading and a vote at the end of this month. The Archbishop urges us all to write to our MP and cards will be provided on the pews. This is a very sensitive topic and there is much emotion in the air but we must not let our individual needs or experiences overwhelm the right thing to do.
