WELCOME TO MASS. TODAY IS THE FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER. Today is also known as Good Shepherd Sunday. When we pray for vocations especially to the priesthood. In the prayer of ordination to the priesthood the ordaining bishop prayers: 'We beseech you Lord, in our weakness, to grant us the helpers that we need to exercise the Priesthood that comes from the Apostles.

God our Father,
you give us the sacraments as signs and
instruments
of your love and mercy.
Draw from amongst your disciples of this diocese
of Birmingham,
men who are willing to generously serve your
Church as priests,
to minister to your people, and to proclaim the
Gospel to all.
We ask this through Jesus Christ, our Good
Shepherd. Amen.

We have felt here in our own parish the effects of the lack of priests at the moment. As was mentioned on Good Friday during the homily, there is an upturn in the numbers of Generation Z who have found themselves coming along to Mass and seeking to grow in faith. The Holy Spirit is certainly active and awakening faith in the hearts of the young.

It is faith which is the answer to shortage of vocations. It has been more than forty years since we last had a priestly ordination from a Banbury parishioner. Let us pray that the Holy Spirit may inspire new vocations amongst us to the sacred priesthood.

When writing this newsletter, I'm hoping that by Sunday we will have heard the senior Cardinal Deacon of the Roman Church proclaim from the balcony of St Peter's 'Annuntio vobis gaudium magnum: habemus Papam!'...I announce to you a great joy: we have a Pope! Do remember our new Pope in your prayers as he embarks on his new and challenging ministry.

Collect

First reading

Acts 13:14, 43b-52

In those days: Paul and Barnabas went on from Perga and came to Antioch in Pisidia. And on the Sabbath day they went into the synagogue and sat down. Many Jews and devout converts to Judaism followed Paul and Barnabas, who, as they spoke with them, urged them to continue in the grace of God.

The next Sabbath almost the whole city gathered to hear the word of the Lord. But when the Jews saw the crowds, they were filled with jealousy and began to contradict what was spoken by Paul, reviling him. And Paul and Barnabas spoke out boldly, saying, 'It was necessary that the word of God be spoken first to you. Since you thrust it aside and judge yourselves unworthy of eternal life, behold, we are turning to the Gentiles. For so the Lord has commanded us, saying, "I have made you a light for the Gentiles, that you may bring salvation to the ends of the earth." 'And when the Gentiles heard this, they began rejoicing and glorifying the word of the Lord, and as many as were appointed to eternal life believed. And the word of the Lord was spreading throughout the whole region. But the Jews incited the devout women of high standing and the leading men of the city, stirred up persecution against Paul and Barnabas, and drove them out of their district. But they shook off the dust from their feet against them and went to Iconium. And the disciples were filled with joy and with the Holy Spirit.

Then one of the elders addressed me, saying, 'These are the ones coming out of the great tribulation. They have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb. Therefore they are before the throne of God, and serve him day and night in his temple; and he who sits on

the throne will shelter them with his presence. They shall hunger no more, neither thirst any more; the sun shall not strike them, nor any scorching heat. For the Lamb in the midst of the throne will be their shepherd, and he will guide them to springs of living water, and God will wipe away every tear from their eyes.'

And may you, who have already risen with Christ in Baptism through faith, by living in a right manner on this earth be united with him in the homeland of heaven.
