WELCOME TO MASS - If you are visiting the parish today, it is good to have you with us. You will find the readings on the back of this newsletter, and the Mass setting and hymn numbers on the hymn board.

Today is the Fifth Sunday of Easter. Easter isn't just a day, but a season, a season which continues for fifty days until the feast of Pentecost. In these days the truth of the Lord's resurrection should be uppermost in our minds for, as the Easter prefaces to the Eucharistic Prayer proclaim that: 'in this time above all to laud you yet more gloriously, when Christ our Passover has been sacrificed.'

We also continue to pray for our new Pope. Today marks the Mass celebrating the beginning of his Petrine ministry in St Peter's Square, and no doubt he will be surrounded by many pilgrims as well as dignitaries from around the world. It reminds us that the Church can be a huge force for good, and not just on the international stage, but in our own local communities.

Below is the message from the Archbishop welcoming the election of Pope Leo IIVth.

Dear friends,

I welcome the wonderful news of the election of Cardinal Robert Prevost as our new Holy Father, Pope Leo XIV. As he prepared to give us his first blessing as Pope in St Peter's Square, he also gave us a message of joyful encouragement, calling us to be bridge-builders who are the light of Christ in the world. As the first Pope from the United States of America he also remembered the people of Chiclayo in Peru where he had served as bishop until 2023.

I have just spent the last few days at Buckfast Abbey with all the Bishops of England and Wales as we prayed for the Cardinals in Conclave and as we waited to hear whom the Holy Spirit would identify as the Successor of Peter. It will be a great joy to serve the Church's mission inspired by the guidance of Pope Leo. All the lay faithful, the Religious and clergy of our Archdiocese are praying for our new Holy Father that he may serve the Church for many years and be richly blessed in his apostolate.

A couple of important pointers regarding Holy Communion - If you are not a Catholic, or you are a Catholic not coming to Holy Communion, you are very welcome to come forward for a blessing at the time of Holy Communion. Please place your right hand on your left shoulder or just ask for a blessing.

By virtue of their ordination only priests and deacons are able to give a blessing during the liturgy, so if you wish to receive a blessing please make sure you are in a line leading to a priest or deacon, and if not-just cross sides.

For those receiving Holy Communion in the hand, please consume the host immediately in front of the minister. Please do not walk away with the host in your hands. We must always give the utmost honour and respect to the Holy Sacrament – for it is the Lord himself!

First reading

Acts 14:21b-27

In those days: Paul and Barnabas returned to Lystra and to Iconium and to Antioch, strengthening the souls of the disciples, encouraging them to continue in the faith, and saying that through many tribulations we must enter the kingdom of God. And when they had appointed elders for them in every church, with prayer and fasting they committed them to the Lord in whom they had believed.

Then they passed through Pisidia and came to Pamphylia. And when they had spoken the word in Perga, they went down to Attalia, and from there they sailed to Antioch, where they had been commended to the grace of God for the work that they had fulfilled. And when they arrived and gathered the church together, they declared all that God had done with them, and how he had opened a door of faith to the Gentiles.
