Thursday is the Solemnity of the Ascension and is a holyday of obligation: Masses will be celebrated at Kineton 10.00am, Brailes 12.30pm and Shipston 7.00pm.

We had a wonderful afternoon last Sunday at Oscott College. There were 37 of us from the two parishes and it was lovely to meet some of the seminarians, tour the college, have afternoon tea and then evening prayer and benediction with the staff and seminarians. Please keep in your prayers the need for vocations to the Priesthood, particularly to serve the Archdiocese of Birmingham.

On the fortieth day after Easter the Ascension of the Lord is celebrated. "Christ's Ascension marks the definitive entrance of Jesus' humanity into God's heavenly domain, whence he will come again; this humanity in the meantime hides him from the eyes of men. Jesus Christ, the head of the Church, precedes us into the Father's glorious kingdom so that we, the members of his Body, may live in the hope of one day being with him for ever.

Jesus Christ, having entered the sanctuary of heaven once and for all, intercedes constantly for us as the mediator who assures us of the permanent outpouring of the Holy Spirit". (Catechism of the Catholic Church)

"Holy Spirit, Third Person of the Blessed Trinity, Spirit of truth, love and holiness, proceeding from the Father and the Son and equal to Them in all things, I adore you and love You with all my heart. Teach me, Divine Spirit to know and seek my last end; grant me the holy fear of God; grant me true contrition and patience. Do not let me fall into sin. Give me an increase of faith, hope and charity, and bring forth into my soul the virtues proper to my state of life. Make me a faithful disciple of Jesus and an obedient child of the Church. Give me efficacious grace sufficient to keep the Commandments and to receive the Sacraments worthily. Give me the four Cardinal Virtues, Your Seven Gifts, your Twelve fruits. Raise me to perfection in the state of life to which You have called me and lead me through a happy death to everlasting life. I ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen".
