Allow me to write some words about our Pilgrimage to Fatima a couple of weeks ago. I am grateful to Angela Danks for finding an official photograph of pilgrims praying the Rosary at an evening candlelit service. Being one of 270,000 people praying is a powerful experience. I accompanied Father Tony on the eve of the Feast of Our Lady of Fatima and as the service concluded we could see a drone flying around. The only way to capture the photograph on the left below.



We left Fatima and travelled to Lisbon to continue our pilgrimage. The photograph in the middle above is of Christ the King which is visible from many parts of the city. It was inspired by the iconic statue of Christ the Redeemer in Rio de Janeiro.

In Lisbon we had an amazing opportunity to close the circle on our previous pilgrimage to Padua. The photograph on the right above is of St Anthony, outside his Church where we had Mass celebrated by Father Tony and Father Clive. St Anthony's Church is built over the house where he was born. St Anthony studied at the University of Lisbon and then moved to Italy settling in Padua. I continue to be moved by my memories of our visit to his tomb in the Basilica dedicated to him in Padua. Like a lot of you, we have been praying to St Anthony for most of our lives.
