## **Day for Life**

Every year the Church in England, Wales, Scotland, and Ireland marks the Day for Life, as a reminder of the need to respect and protect the inherent value and dignity of each life. This year it will be celebrated on 15th June, Trinity Sunday. Ahead of the Day for Life, we invite the faithful in all three conferences to join in prayer through the Novena for Life. This will run up to the Feast of the Visitation, between the 23rd and the 31st of May. Prayers for each day can be found on the Day for Life page of the Catholic Bishops' Conference of England and Wales' website. On the website you can also find a special message from the bishops and more prayers and resources.

On 15<sup>th</sup> June we also ask parishes to hold a second collection for the Day for Life Fund. Every year the fund allocates over £200,000 in grants to organisations which promote respect for life in various ways. Donations can be also made online via the Catholic Bishops' Conference website, where you will find out more information about Day for Life.

Month of May is traditionally observed as 'Month of Mary'. In many parishes, Rosary is prayed communally before Masses, particularly during the month of May and October. Anyone willing to help, please let Fr. Arul know. Volunteers are welcome to lead the Rosary.

A couple of important pointers regarding Holy Communion: If you are not a Roman Catholic, a member of a church in full communion with it, or an Orthodox unable to attend an Orthodox Liturgy, you are warmly invited to come forward for a blessing at the time of Holy Communion. (Holy Communion cannot be given to all, as it is for us the sign of unity in the faith. Communion is not bread and wine, but the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of God the Son. Let us pray for unity among all Christians, as God wills). Please place your right hand on your left shoulder or just ask for a blessing.

By virtue of their ordination only priests and deacons are able to give a blessing during the liturgy, so if you wish to receive a blessing, please make sure you are in a line leading to a priest or deacon, and if not-just cross sides.

For those receiving Holy Communion in the hand, please consume the host immediately in front of the minister. Please do not walk away with the host in your hands. We must always give the utmost honour and respect to the Holy Sacrament – for it is the Lord himself!
