Second Collection for Clergy Training Fund Today

Pope Leo XIV

"I welcome the wonderful news of the election of Cardinal Robert Prevost as our new Holy Father, Pope Leo XIV. As he prepared to give us his first blessing as Pope in St Peter's Square, he also gave us a message of joyful encouragement, calling us to be bridge-builders who are the light of Christ in the world. As the first Pope from the United States of America he also remembered the people of Chiclayo in Peru where he had served as bishop until 2023.

I have just spent the last few days at Buckfast Abbey with all the Bishops of England and Wales as we prayed for the Cardinals in Conclave and as we waited to hear whom the Holy Spirit would identify as the Successor of Peter. It will be a great joy to serve the Church's mission inspired by the guidance of Pope Leo. All the lay faithful, the Religious and clergy of our Archdiocese are praying for our new Holy Father that he may serve the Church for many years and be richly blessed in his apostolate". "There is nothing remotely Christian, American, or morally defensible about a policy that takes children away from their parents and warehouses them in cages. This is being carried out in our name and the shame is on us all". (Pope Leo XIV), commenting of US policy reference migrants).

It is sad, is it not, that since Pope Francis' death, some have gone out of their way to focus on what he failed to achieve rather than on the impact he had on our world and culture. Popes, during their limited time as Supreme Pontiff, seldom bring about major changes in church teaching. As we continue to thank God for Pope Francis, let us continue in gratitude, to pray for him while praying, in hope, for Pope Leo XIV.

What, then, is your hope? Do you hope that Leo XIV will change the rule of clerical celibacy and allow Catholic priests to marry? Endorse the ordination of women priests? Approve same sex marriage? Encourage gender identity? End all scandals, financial and sexual, within the Catholic Church? Allow any divorced and re-married Catholic to receive Holy Communion? Always get it right when addressing wrongdoings among clergy? Stick his neck out and challenge world leaders, including national and local Catholic leaders? Welcome those on the margins and who feel unwelcome, including LGBTQIA+? Because all of these issues, and more, are ones that will confront Pope Leo XIV as well as being a pastor for 1.4 billion Catholics in diverse countries and cultures worldwide.

Or do you want a man who will be a model of Christian living in whom he is, in what he says, in what he does, in where he goes? And surely you will want a man of prayer who will convince a self-sufficient world of its need for God in Jesus Christ and, in so doing, find some resolution to the problems and pains on 21C culture?

Whom do you want Pope Leo XIV to be?

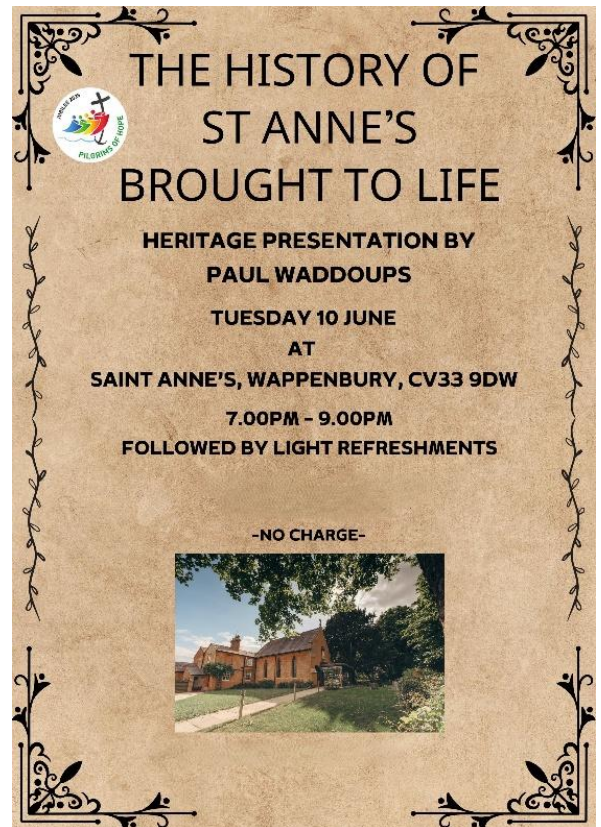

THE CHURCH

Preliminary Information

THE SHAPE of the pre-Vatican II Catholic Church was often described as a pyramid. At the apex was the Pope. Beneath him were the Cardinals, the Bishops, the Priests - in descending order. Finally, there were the layfolk. At each level one was subject directly or indirectly to those above. Nothing was normally done without their approval, or at least their knowledge.

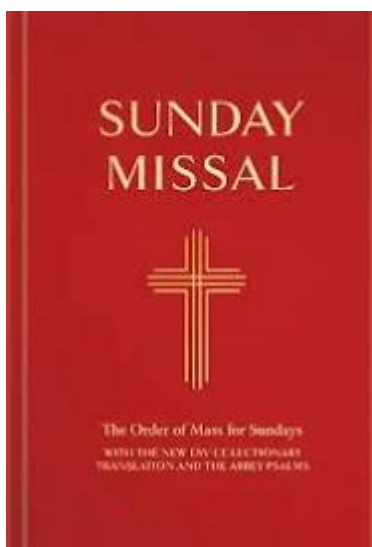
The Vatican II Constitution on the Church redefined the Church and changed its pyramid shape. This change was to have repercussions affecting the relationships not only between the hierarchy and the laity, but between the Church and other Christian groups, and between the Church and the World. These changes passed into the 1983 Code of Canon Law and became the official law of the Catholic Church.

However, for many years these changes made little difference to the life of the Church. In particular, many Vatican officials found it difficult to leave behind the mind-set that belonged to the age of the pyramid. Pope Francis set out to implement Vatican II, notably through the 16th Roman Synod of Bishops on Synodality (2021-2024). This module will lay before you relevant material from the Bible, church history, canon law, sociology and especially the Synod on Synodality. This should help you discern the main features of the Church of tomorrow. By the end of this module, you should be in a better position to understand on-going changes to church structures and to live and work with confidence within the Church.
