A Way Forward with Pope Leo XIV



Here are a few passages from the homily given by Pope Leo XIV in St. Peter's Square during the Mass of Inauguration of the Petrine Ministry May 18, 2025.

These, perhaps, point us in the direction that Pope Leo is inviting us to travel as we journey through, and beyond, this Jubilee Year of Hope 2025.

"I was chosen, without any merit of my own, and now, with fear and trembling, I come to you as a brother, who desires to be the servant of your faith and your joy, walking with you on the path of God's love, for He wants us all to be united in one family. Love and unity: these are the two dimensions of the mission entrusted to Peter by Jesus.

How can Peter carry out this task? The Gospel tells us that it is possible only because his own life was touched by the infinite and unconditional love of God, even in the hour of his failure and denial.

Consequently, when Jesus asks Peter, "Simon, son of John, do you love me more than these?" (Jn 21:16), he is referring to the love of the Father. It is as if Jesus said to him, "Only if you have known and experienced this love of God, which never fails, will you be able to feed my lambs. Only in the love of God the Father will you be able to love your brothers and sisters with that same 'more,' that is, by offering your life for your brothers and sisters."

Here is our invitation and challenge: consciously to try to experience and to understand the love of God for us, especially when life seems not so good for us, and when events challenge us to believe and to trust.

Are you taking time to hear God speaking to you in the events of your very ordinary day to day life, because God will, without doubt, speak to each one of us?

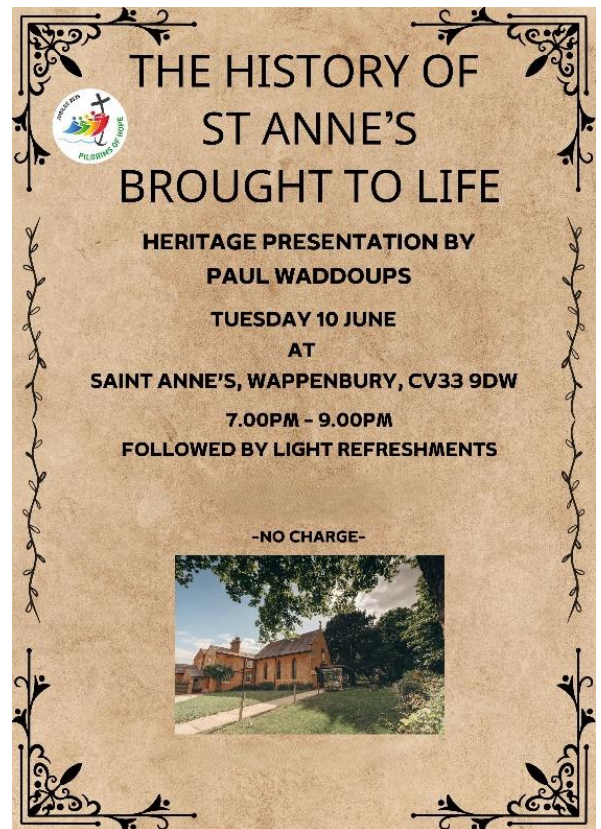

THE CHURCH

Preliminary Information

THE SHAPE of the pre-Vatican II Catholic Church was often described as a pyramid. At the apex was the Pope. Beneath him were the Cardinals, the Bishops, the Priests - in descending order. Finally, there were the layfolk. At each level one was subject directly or indirectly to those above. Nothing was normally done without their approval, or at least their knowledge.

The Vatican II Constitution on the Church redefined the Church and changed its pyramid shape. This change was to have repercussions affecting the relationships not only between the hierarchy and the laity, but between the Church and other Christian groups, and between the Church and the World. These changes passed into the 1983 Code of Canon Law and became the official law of the Catholic Church.

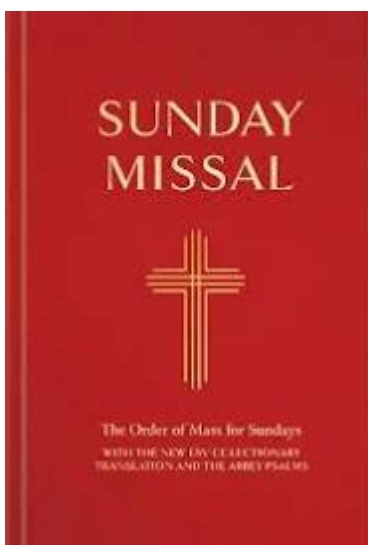
However, for many years these changes made little difference to the life of the Church. In particular, many Vatican officials found it difficult to leave behind the mind-set that belonged to the age of the pyramid. Pope Francis set out to implement Vatican II, notably through the 16th Roman Synod of Bishops on Synodality (2021-2024). This module will lay before you relevant material from the Bible, church history, canon law, sociology and especially the Synod on Synodality. This should help you discern the main features of the Church of tomorrow. By the end of this module, you should be in a better position to understand on-going changes to church structures and to live and work with confidence within the Church.

Vacancy at the Princethorpe Foundation

Estates Operatives – Crackley Hall School, Kenilworth Required to start in July, we seek to recruit a full-time Estates Operative to join our friendly and professional Estates Department, working alongside our team at Crackley Hall to provide a safe and high-quality working, learning and recreational environment.

Estates Operatives work closely with the Site Supervisor to perform a range of caretaker-type duties. The role is crucial in providing a fully functioning, organised, clean, tidy, secure and well-maintained site for use by its many stakeholders.

The role is all year round (52 weeks) for 37.5 hours per week (with a one-hour unpaid break per day). The working pattern is predominately Monday to Friday, 10.30am to 7.00pm.

Some flexibility will be required in respect of working hours, but there are also opportunities for additional work to support key events and opportunities to earn overtime/time off in lieu.

The salary point is D5 of the Princethorpe Foundation support staff scale, currently £12.50 per hour. The actual salary based on 37.5 hours per week is £24,375.

An annual leave allowance of 25 days plus 8 bank holidays is included with the role.

Foundation PA – Princethorpe College - Required to start in August, we seek to recruit a full time Foundation Office PA to join our friendly and professional team to provide secretarial and administrative support for the Foundation Office, which comprises of a group of senior leaders.

The Foundation Office PA must be able to operate independently to ensure the operational effectiveness and continuity of support services. This requires the ability to plan carefully and anticipate possible outcomes. A close, efficient and effective working relationship between the senior leaders within the Foundation Office and the PA is essential in order that the many decisions and actions are dealt with promptly at the appropriate level.

This is a full-time 37.5 hour a week post, required to work all year round, Monday to Friday 8.30am to 5.00pm including a 60 minute unpaid break. The role is based at Princethorpe College.

The starting salary for this role is between MA17 and MB2 of the Princethorpe Foundation pay scales, £35,237 and £39,878 per annum full-time equivalent by negotiation, depending on qualifications and relevant experience.

Benefits include 28 days holiday per annum plus bank holidays (pro rata). The Foundation operates a full site closure between Christmas and New Year; these three days are not required to be taken from the holiday entitlement.
