Writing this newsletter mid week, with a Papal Conclave deciding on our next Holy Father....this is tricky! People will want to know who the new Pope is, where he comes from, what he thinks etc...all the usual questions. The media coverage has been patchy to say the least with some reporters demonstrating a poor grasp of the basic facts and most not understanding the spiritual dimensions at all.

You will hear many say...the Holy Spirit will guide the Cardinals to make the right choice. That is a great mistake! There are cases where the wrong choice was made with some dubious characters seated on the Throne of St Peter. It is true that the Holy Spirit has always protected the Church and Catholic Faith has never been interfered with even by the worst. Take Alexander VI...bribing fellow Cardinals or "removing" them, fathering children with mistresses...he did not corrupt the Faith handed down from the Apostles but he was hardly a role model. Or Stephen VI who had his decomposed predecessor dug up, dressed in papal robes and put on trial! However awful some of these figures were, the Faith remained secure and Rome remained the centre of the Church.

Those days are long gone and we have been blessed with some saintly men in recent centuries. Think of the last three...St John Paul II, Pope Benedict and Pope Francis. Different in temperament and emphasis but all true disciples of the Risen Lord.

And just as last week's Gospel for the Third Sunday of Easter seemed designed for this period of decisions, so also this week on "Good Shepherd Sunday":

" My sheep know my Voice; I know them and they follow me."

By the time this newsletter is printed we may well be looking at the 267 th successor of St Peter. May the Holy Spirit give him wisdom, courage and above all a deep love of the Lord.
