

10th Anniversary of 'Laudato Si'

Pope Francis' encyclical on 'care for our common home'

Laudato Si was the second encyclical (letter circulated to catholic churches worldwide) of Pope Francis and was published in 2015. It was heralded as a timely reminder of our responsibilities in caring for the

earth and all its creatures. Being a Live Simply parish enables Catholic Leamington to be part of the Laudato Si journey and its 10th anniversary is a good opportunity to reflect on our response to Pope Francis's call over the past 10 years and inspire us to continue on the journey

In Laudato Si Pope Francis calls on us all to respond as part of our Christian duty - to protect, nurture and respect all God's creatures and his creation. To avoid waste and over consumption and to lead simple lives using only what we need. How hard is that? As we know it is very hard in today's word with all its complexities

'What kind of encyclical has Pope Francis written? The encyclical Laudato Si' is considered part of the Catholic Social Teaching tradition. Although there are many previous statements by popes and bishops on the question of our place Church to in creation, this is the first social encyclical in the Catholic address the complex social and ecological crisis in a direct and specific way

Laudato Si' complements what the Catechism of the Catholic Church says, which is that our responsibility is to care for our world and not 'steal' resources from future generations. It speaks of the intrinsic value of all creatures, not just humans, and of protecting the climate and biodiversity as part of the common good

Proposing lines of action at personal, political and economic levels, it demands a redefinition of progress that responds to both the cry of the poor and the cry of the earth. Pope Francis calls us to a radical ecological conversion, and invites us to a spirituality that is full of gratitude for the gifts of creation, with a special place for contemplation and Sabbath rest'

So for our Parish and ourselves, what does this mean?

Live Simply - living it out in our homes and parishes - since 2014 when St Peter's achieved the 'Live Simply' Award we have looked at how we can better take care of the earth by

- Living simply
- Living sustainably
- Living in solidarity with the poor

We have had Eco events, recycled, held liturgies, had tree walks, 'walk to church Sundays' and supported others in their efforts.

But... there is plenty more to do! Come and join us and give us more ideas - we need more hands 'God had no hands but ours'.

AILGRIMS OF

Croatian is the language of locals in Medjugorje. 'Pilgrimage' in Croatian means "Walk with God". 'Medjugorje' means 'between mountains', referring to the hills that surround this amazing place. We all felt as we were indeed walking with God in a special and

meaningful way every minute of our pilgrimage. Deciding to go in the first week of May because it's Our Lady's month, the weather we expected was to be not too warm and not too chilly either. We had wonderful weather every day of our pilgrimage, regardless of the weather forecast which forecasted rain and even thunderstorms. We had sunny, warm weather every day. Twenty-seven people travelled there in our party. Thank God a young Capuccin friar, Brother Sheline, joined us and was our amazing spiritual guide. We had an extraordinary, wonderful time individually on a personal and collectively on a group level as well. Many pilgrims in our group shared personal stories of healing, newly found faith, insights, answers, encounters, special personal moments of extraordinary graces. We are praying about it and planning to find the way to share these incredible testimonies with you and all the parishioners who are opened to hear them

We had a great, local guide, a lady who was born and raised there in a Medjugorje. She was a genuine, devoted catholic and obviously to her and to all locals the events there are credible. They believe in it all and stand for it boldly even though it began 44 years ago in the middle of brutal communist dictatorship where the local police tried everything to threaten them and stop them spreading the news of the apparitions of Our Lady to the six children from June 1981, the time of the first apparition. Our guide did her job with a mission in mind to serve a higher purpose, God. She treated us like Our Lady had personally invited each one of us

She took us around the most famous locations there: St James's Church, where we had nightly, powerful masses, homilies, rosaries, adorations, healing services and confessions. We were together at the two famous hills pilgrims often climb, where apparitions began. She took us to incredible speeches and testimonies of local priests and citizens, who had extraordinary stories to share, conversions linked to Our Lady, The Queen Of Peace of Medjugorje -as they refer to her there

A few thoughts from pilgrims since we came back:

"The sense of love and spirituality was so strong throughout Medjugorje. Everyone we met was helpful and caring, from the amazing staff in the hotel, to our guides on the pilgrimage and the people on the street. Thank you to the people of our entire parish in helping those who wished to travel to Medjugorje reach this place of adoration and wonder", "My time in Medjugorje was amazing and everyone who is able to should go there as they will enjoy it and get something out of it", "I have never visited a place where the guides engage so deeply with the place and pass that on. The amount of young people there and with such natural enthusiasm" "I liked the hill walking and Patrick's castle. Next time I'm going to run up them.", "The good news about a pilgrimage is you get your feelings back. Bad news about a pilgrimage is you get your feelings back." Boy did it happen to me, every day. Through confession and sharing I experienced many days of emotional healing with fellow pilgrims and the presence of Our Lady Of Peace. Amazing place, amazing pilgrims", "Wonderful experience! Would go again tomorrow!"

Conclusion: We want to say thank you to the parish, sponsors and prayer supporters who all stepped up with their share of support. We had an amazing time and we can only encourage everyone to consider making a pilgrimage to any shrine, but especially to Medjugorje, to this oasis of Heaven on Earth meant to help particularly our turbulent age of confusion and unbelief. One absolutely outstanding experience for us, I think, was in the meaningful ways we were able to connect and grow together as a community: friendships were born and would love this strengthening experience of fellowship to spread and grow among our parishioners

We soon will come up with an opportunity to meet and share and hear our experiences and possibly we will come up with a regular prayer group meeting as well occasionally online and sometime in person. We still are thinking and praying about the best next step or fruit to bear from our pilgrimage supported by you all. Thank you again
