## Today we celebrate the Solemnity of Corpus Christi.

A warm welcome to St John's and St Joseph's to any visitors today. We also welcome Canon David Hartley and Bishop William Kenney who will be celebrating the Sunday Masses this weekend. We are grateful to them for helping out during Fr Philip's convalescence. Thanks also to Fr Craig Davies from Bicester who has celebrated the First Communion Masses. Fr Philip began his physio last Friday, and so hopefully his time of 'confinement' will be drawing to an end!

**Congratulations** to the children at St Joseph's who made their first Holy Communion yesterday, and at St John's last Saturday, and for those being prepared from St John's school who will make their first Holy Communion this Saturday.

The Feast of Corpus Christi (The Body of Christ) is a solemnity honouring the Blessed Eucharist. The primary thanksgiving for the Eucharist was always Maundy Thursday where the liturgy of that night focuses our minds and hearts on the gift the Lord gave of himself on that night he was betrayed. However, The Lord's coming betrayal and Passion tempers that sense of celebration.

In the 13th Century there was a great strengthening, understanding and renewal of the Eucharist in the hearts of Christians, and today's feast of Corpus Christi was one of its fruits. Traditionally it was celebrated on a Thursday – the first free Thursday after the Easter cycle - but is often now celebrated on the Sunday following – as it is here in England and Wales.

Today's feast reminds us of the wonderful gift that is the Blessed Eucharist – that the Lord Jesus truly becomes present in bread and wine, which becomes by the power of Christ's word his body and blood. In the Eucharist our Lord is both our Divine food, and the sacrifice we offer.

"What wonderful majesty! O sublime humility!

That the Lord of the whole universe...should humble himself like this in the form of a little bread". (St Francis of Assisi)

"For what you see is simply bread and a cup – this is the information your eyes report. But your faith demands far subtler insight: the bread is Christ's body; the cup is Christ's blood." (St Augustine of Hippo)

For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.

#### Gospel

Luke 9:11b-17

At that time: Jesus spoke to the crowd of the kingdom of God and cured those who needed healing. Now the day began to wear away, and the Twelve came and said to him, 'Send the crowd away to go into the surrounding villages and countryside to find lodging and get provisions, for we are here in a desolate place.' But he said to them, 'You give them something to eat.' They said, 'We have no more than five loaves and two fish — unless we are to go and buy food for all these people.' For there were about five thousand men. And he said to his disciples, 'Make them sit down in groups of about fifty each.' And they did so, and made them all sit down. And taking the five loaves and the two fish, he looked up to heaven and said a blessing over them. Then he broke the loaves and gave them to the disciples to set before the crowd. And they all ate and were satisfied. And what was left over was picked up, twelve baskets of broken pieces.
