**Evensong at St George's**: As part of their anniversary celebrations there is a performance of Byrd's Mass at 6.00pm this Sunday (22<sup>nd</sup> June) performed by the Cantamus Choir. You are warmly invited.

Holy Communion incorporates us to the life of Christ, to the death of Christ, and to members of the Mystical Body, their joys and sorrows. In Communion we have unity with the life of Christ, the Christ born on Bethlehem, who lived in Galilee, who talked, who suffered, died, rose from the dead, is at the right hand of the Father, and is infusing His life into His Mystical Body. We receive divine life in Communion. Our Blessed Lord said "He that eateth Me, the same shall life by Me". Actually, He receives us and we become incorporated into Him. There's a kind of transfusion. Just as in the physical body there is a transfusion of blood or life so here there is a tremendous transfusion of divine life into our souls in Communion. At Communion we always have a deep sense of unworthiness. The communion prayer is "Lord I am not worthy" Venerable Fulton Sheen (Your Life is Worth Living)

Soul of Christ, sanctify me. Body of Christ, save me.

Blood of Christ, inebriate me. Water from the side of Christ, wash me.

Passion of Christ, strengthen me. Good Jesus, hear me.

Within your wounds hide me. Permit me not to be separated from you.

From the wicked foe, defend me. At the hour of my death, call me and bid me come to you

That with your saints I may praise you

For ever and ever. Amen.
