Dear Friends of Holy Trinity

This last week I was privileged to spend time in one of the great London churches, St Patrick's, Soho, the first dedicated to Ireland's patron saint since the troubles of the Sixteenth and following centuries. It is a stunningly beautiful place of prayer, worship and outreach to the homeless and it was a privilege to "man the shop" while the parish priest took a short break.

St Patrick's is a reminder of less happy times when Christians in this country were set against each other and Catholics in particular were persecuted, hunted down and sometimes executed in the most horrible manner. In fact it was an Irishman, St Oliver Plunkett who was the last to be martyred in this country, in 1681, after a show trial. 2025 is the 400th anniversary of his birth and the 50th anniversary of his canonisation.

Mercifully, we live in happier times, at least in these islands. 60 years ago the great Second Vatican Council was nearing its conclusion. One of its lofty objectives was to break down the barriers between Christians and begin to heal old wounds. The Decree on Ecumenism...Unitatis Redintegratio begins: "The restoration of unity among all Christians is one of the principal concerns of the Second Vatican Council. Christ the Lord founded One Church and One Church only." This wonderful document sets out the positive approach to dialogue, then almost completely non- existent, between the Catholic Church and the other Christian bodies which had separated in those troubled years that saw the disintegration of the Body of Christ among bitterness and recrimination. Since then much progress has been made and Christians can discuss their differences with respect and sympathy. Local initiatives like Churches Together in Charlbury/Chipping Norton see believers meeting regularly. Why all this effort? In today's Gospel Jesus tells His disciples that the Unity of Love between the Father and the Son is to be shared with them..."that they may all be one...that the world may believe You have sent me." So Christian unity is not an option, it is an imperative, as this state demonstrates the Divine Love that is the only real hope for the world, so often enmeshed in strife and discord.

Next Sunday we arrive at Pentecost, the end of Eastertide. May we all pray this next week for the Holy Spirit to fill us and become a living part of our daily lives.

Next weekend our daughter's wedding ("La Fiesta") is taking place in Oxford/Charlbury, having begun in Scotland and ending eventually in Spain, so I am grateful again to Frs Martin and Paul for stepping into the breach. Between pilgrimage, hospital and Fiesta this has been an unusually un-routine phase and I am looking forward to settling back into the normal patterns of life. It always gives me pleasure to say at the end of Mass: 'Masses as usual'.

God bless everyone and a big thank you for all your prayers and messages of support. Things seem good. Fr Clive
