## **Dear Friends**

This Sunday, the first after the end of Eastertide, is sometimes called "The Preacher's nightmare"! This is because the subject of the liturgy is that central mystery, the Holy and Undivided Trinity, One God in Three Persons. Week by week we affirm our belief in this fundamental statement of Christian Faith when we stand and together recite the Nicene Creed( or to give it the correct name The Nicene-Constantinopolitan Creed). "I believe in One God..." The Catechism states: "The mystery of the Most Holy Trinity is the central mystery of Christian faith and life. It is the mystery of God in Himself. It is therefore the source of all the other mysteries of faith, the light that enlightens them. It is the most fundamental and essential teaching in the hierarchy of the truths of faith."

We can just about grasp all this but what does God as One and God as Three actually mean? St Augustine, that great thinker and pastor, wrestled for between 16-20 years with this in his book "On the Holy Trinity". Searching for analogies and explanations he took the biblical statement "God is Love" and spoke of the Father who loves, the Son who is loved and the Spirit who is Love between them. He also talked of the Triune God as Memory, Understanding and Will. All three activities of the mind are interactive, three parts of the same essence. Perhaps we should heed St Basil who writing about this said: "Let things beyond understanding be honoured in silence"! We cannot grasp this because it is a mystery. The Church calls on us to accept and to worship, in acknowledgement of the God who has come among us and is still active in His Church and World.

Finally...I am hoping that there will be no more interruptions to our usual Mass pattern. I am grateful as ever to Frs. Martin, Paul and Tony for being such great supports to our parishes. At the recent Priests' Conference in Birmingham that Fr Tony and I attended, we were both struck by the number of clergy in religious orders that have been sent from Africa and India in particular, to keep the parishes going. They are often young, enthusiastic and spiritual and it heartened us both. Like the Irish priests who ran so much in previous years, it may be that this fresh blood in the system will bring renewal and revival.
