This weekend, our Second collection is for our Parish Maintenance Fund

Ordinary Time: With the Feast of Pentecost, the Season of Easter is over, and we resume Ordinary Time with Week 10 in Ordinary Time, Psalter week 2.

Message from Fr Damian. Pentecost highlights a powerful moment in Christian history when the Holy Spirit came upon the apostles as tongues of fire. This event marked the birth of the Church, giving the apostles the strength and courage to preach the Good News. The Holy Spirit's presence was a visible sign that God was with them, guiding and empowering their mission.

The tongues of fire rested on each apostle, symbolising that the Holy Spirit was for everyone, not just a select few. This moment united the apostles in purpose, breaking down barriers and filling them with the confidence to spread Christ's teachings. The apostles spoke in different languages, making it clear that the message of Jesus was for all people, regardless of their background or nationality.

Pentecost reminds us of the importance of the Holy Spirit in our own lives. Just as the Spirit empowered the apostles, it empowers us to live as true followers of Christ. We may not see tongues of fire, but the Spirit is present, giving us the gifts we need to share God's love with others. Each of us is called to use our unique talents to contribute to the Church and our communities.

Day for Life, 15th **June 2025.** This year's Day for Life is the day in the Church's year dedicated to raising awareness about the meaning and value of human life at every stage and in every condition. Stratford Food Bank: They have been incredibly busy during May half term, giving out 20 lunch box hampers to families with children, besides emergency food parcels, which have fed 44 children. During May, they gave out 4.3 tonnes of food. The donations from churches last month totalled 177kg. They had a food drive in Tesco food, which was remarkably successful, bringing in 536kg of food. This month's most needed items are Tinned curry, Tinned Corned Beef, Instant whip, Toilet roll, Pasta sauce, Nappies, Chocolate, Coffee and Deodorant or any other items you can spare.
