AUGUST: MONTH OF THE ASSUMPTION OF OUR LADY

WELCOME TO MASS: If you are a visitor, or a new arrival in the area, do say hello to Fr Stephen, Deacon Paul, or Fr Kevin. There is tea and coffee and conversation available after both Masses on Sundays in the hall.

Sunday's Readings: Today's great feast of Our Lady has a separate Vigil Mass with its own readings. Do take a moment to read the scripture given for both Masses, to deepen your appreciation of Our Lady through Holy Scripture. All the readings speak about the same thing: the uniqueness of Our Lady and her rightful place in heaven: the Old Testament is completely fulfilled in the New. King David prepares a special place for the Ark of God, the 'box' where God dwelt among His people. The Israelites rejoice. She is the 'Queen Mother' who is given an exalted place just as the Israelite kings gave their mothers. How much more this applies to the Mother of Christ, our King. Our Lady was the first dwelling place of God made flesh: the Ark of the New Covenant and we rejoice before her. St Paul speaks of the end of death's sting and victory, because Jesus's resurrection shows that death is not the end. Our Lady's Assumption places her, like Christ, among the first-fruits of all who have fallen asleep. It is the Christian hope that all God's faithful will also be the fruits of Jesus's resurrection, just like His Blessed Mother. A woman in the crowd shouts at Jesus how happy must be the womb that bore him. True of course, but Jesus replies that happier still are those that hear and keep the word of God. Keeping the word of God is exactly what Mary did. It is her faithfulness to God that makes possible her Mothering of God. In that way, we can all be like Mary—not in our physical mothering of Jesus because that's already been done, but in hearing and keeping of God's word. Through Mary and her faithfulness, God has done wonderful things for her, and, praise God, for us too.
